I. GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS :

1. Before filling up of the application form, carefully read all the instructions given in the prospectus and application
2. Fill the application carefully and legibly without overwriting.
3. All enclosures prescribed should be true photocopies, duly attested by Group A or B Officer. The originals should be produced at the time of Counselling and Admission.

5. **Application with incomplete or insufficient particulars or without required enclosures or those received after the last date mentioned will be summarily rejected. The selection committee admits no responsibility for return of such application forms.**
6. Applications received by speed post/ courier or any other means after the last date and time will not be accepted irrespective of the date of booking.
7. Non-service candidates should send their applications directly to the Secretary, Selection Committee marking the above address.

8. Service candidates should get their applications forwarded only through the proper channel with the remarks of the forwarding authorities in the format prescribed in the application form. If not, applications will be summarily rejected.
9. Advance copies from the service candidates will not be accepted.
10. All pages in the application form should be signed in full by the candidate.
11. An attested passport size photograph should be affixed in the front page of the application form in the space provided. Please affix a recent photograph to enable easy identification in the Examination hall and to avoid the embarrassment of being sent out of the hall otherwise. Similarly, two recent passport size photographs for the identification slips should be affixed in the spaces provided. All photos on the application form should be identical.
12. If a candidate desires an immediate acknowledgement, should advise the postal or courier service for the same and pay the required fees themselves. Intimation card confirming receipt of application with required particulars and date of examination will be sent subsequently to candidates who are found to be prima facie eligible. No other letter or hall ticket will be sent to candidates and candidates should quote their Application registration number in future correspondences.
13. All communications to the candidates will be sent only to the mailing address given by the candidate in the application. The selection committee will not be held responsible for postal delays and wrong messages conveyed by the postal department or courier service. Belated receipt of filled-in application will be rejected summarily. No correspondence in this regard shall be entertained.
14. Request for extension of time for submission of documents beyond the prescribed date and time shall not be entertained.
15. The candidate must write his/her Name and Address on the reverse side of the demand draft.
16. Candidate who had already acquired a post graduate M.D.(Homoeopathy) degree in any one of the Homoeopathy disciplines may also apply for another Homoeopathy discipline subject to the following conditions.

(a) SERVICE CANDIDATES

- i. They will not be considered under the category of service candidates but only as open category candidates.
- ii. They will have to undergo the course at their own cost.
- iii. Their absence will not be treated as on duty during the period of study.
- iv. They will not be granted any study leave for the period of study.
- v. They will not be paid any stipend or salaries for the period of study.

(b) NON SERVICE CANDIDATES

- i. They shall not be paid any stipend during the period of study.
 - ii. They shall undergo the course at their own cost.
 - iii. If they secure the same marks as any other candidate, they will be ranked last among candidates with the same marks irrespective of the provisions found in Clause III Section C sub clause 3.
17. In case of unauthorized absence of candidates continuously for one month or more after getting admitted in the allotted college, the candidate will be treated as having discontinued without notice on automatic basis and thus arising vacancy will be filled up from the waiting list depending on the availability of time before the cut-off date for admission as per the T.N. Dr.M.G.R. Medical University guidelines. Candidates will have to give a declaration to this effect at the time of counselling.
18. Those service candidates selected by TNPSC and who have put in less than two years of continuous regular service as on 31-03-2012 either in Tamil Nadu Medical Service or in Local bodies and organizations are not eligible to apply for Post Graduate M.D(Homoeopathy) course under the category of service candidates.

II. ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION TO M.D. (HOMOEOPATHY)

- (a) Candidate should be citizens of India.
- (b) Candidate should possess the degree of Bachelor of Homoeopathic Medicine and Surgery / or equivalent qualification in Homoeopathy included in the Second Schedule to the Homoeopathy Central Council Act 1973 (59 of 1973)
- (c) Except with regard to those candidates who have studied from 9th Standard onwards and have undergone Under Graduate Course (BHMS) in Tamil Nadu.
- (d) Candidates who have native of Tamil Nadu and completed BHMS in other States should furnish a Certificate of permanent residence in Tamil Nadu issued by competent authority only in the specified format in Annexure I and **supported by a copy of Passport/ Ration Card/ Voter's I.D./ Driving License/ Permanent Medical Registration Certificate**. If the copy of the supporting document is not produced, then the application form **will be rejected** . **Permanent residence Certificate submitted later will be summarily rejected.**
- (e) Those candidates who are undergoing CRRI and will be completing their CRRI before the Entrance Examination should enclose a certificate from Head of the Institutions in which they are undergoing the CRRI that they will be completing the CRRI before the date of Entrance examination, failing which their application will be rejected.
- (f) The candidates should have registered their names either in the Central Council of Homoeopathy Medicine, New Delhi (or) in the Tamilnadu Homoeopathy Medical Council, Chennai

III MODE OF SELECTION AND ADMISSION

(A) ENTRANCE EXAMINATION

1. Admission to the course will be made purely on merit, based on the marks obtained in the Entrance Examination to be conducted for admission to the course and added to post-BHMS experience marks that will be calculated as below:

Maximum marks for Written Entrance Examination	:	90 marks
Maximum marks for post-BHMS clinical experience	:	10 marks

Total	:	100 marks

2. The Entrance Examination for admission to the Post Graduate M.D (Homoeopathy) course will be conducted by the Directorate at Government Siddha Medical College, Chennai 600 106. The admission to M.D (Homoeopathy) course under Government quota will be made based on the marks obtained in the entrance examination for the academic year 2012-2013 as set out in the previous section.
3. The Entrance Examination will primarily assess the knowledge and maturity of understanding of the candidate of all medical subjects- theory and clinical, taught at the undergraduate level (BHMS). The questions will be of objective multiple choice type for which four answer options A, B, C, D will be offered. Only one of the options will be the nearest and correct answer and this alone should be selected. The other three answers will be wrong. The correct answer has been verified by a team of Doctors by referring to relevant texts. Each correct answer will be awarded one mark and if a question is not answered, zero mark will be awarded. If more than one answer is selected or any item is marked very faintly or illegibly as seen during the machine scan of answer sheets, the question will be deemed to have not been answered and zero mark will be awarded. It is reiterated that all questions carry equal marks. The total marks accorded will then be computed to a maximum of 90 marks.
4. The question paper will have two hundred (200) objective-type questions consisting of 'Section A' containing 100 (one hundred) self-contained objective-type questions based on the fifteen theory subjects taught in the BHMS course and 'Section B' containing 100 (one hundred) questions based on a short passage (paragraph) which will be given and 3 - 5 objective type questions based on the paragraph. The candidates should answer questions based on the material available including photographs or diagrams if any, and directly analyzing or on its direct implications. The candidate should not assume any data that is not contained in the passage or which is not directly derivable from the information contained in the passage. The decision of the Selection Committee on the content, implications and answer for each type of question is final since much care has been exercised in the formulation of questions and answers. All the 200 questions carry equal marks.
5. The Entrance Examination for MD(Homoeopathy) will be conducted on 15-05-2012 in one session of 3 hours duration at Government Siddha Medical College, in the campus of Arignar Anna Govt. Hospital of Indian Medicine, Chennai 600 106. Candidates should be present and be seated in their allotted places thirty minutes prior to the commencement of examination in order to fill up the relevant particulars and complete examinees identification procedures. Therefore, the total duration of the examination including preparation time is three and half hours (3 ½ hours).

6. Acknowledgement or Intimation card will be sent only to eligible candidates. Admission to the entrance examination does not confer on the candidate the right of admission to the course if found ineligible later.
7. Any candidate who has not received the Intimation Card in time may contact the Secretary, Selection Committee, Directorate of Indian Medicine and Homoeopathy, Chennai 600 106 two days prior to the entrance examination and verify the fact of their eligibility and Application Registration Number for the examination and attend the same.
8. Candidates admitted for entrance examination will have to come to the examination center on their own expense and make their own arrangement for stay.
9. Candidates coming 30 minutes after the scheduled time for commencement of the examination will not be permitted to appear for the examination. This cut-off time coincides with the time around 30 minutes after which all candidates are allowed to open their question papers and commence answering questions.
10. No candidate shall be allowed to carry any textual materials printed or written bits of paper, electronic and telecommunication devices with or without remote sensing like pagers, cellular phones, Pen scanners or electronic diary inside the Hall except the Intimation Card and Identification documents.
11. No candidate will be allowed to leave the hall before the end of the examination. Once a candidate leaves the Hall for any other reasons, he/she will not be permitted to re-enter the hall.
12. Candidate shall maintain strict silence. Any misconduct found out by the Hall Superintendent will result in the forfeiture of the right to continue the examination. His / Her answer sheet will not be considered for valuation. Further he/she will not be allowed to apply for the PG course for the next two years. The decision of the Hall Superintendent in this connection shall be final.
13. Answers should be shaded with blue or black ball pen (NOT GEL), in the OMR sheets as per the instructions given in the OMR Sheet.
14. The question paper, blank sheets (if any), OMR answer sheets, etc. are the property of the Selection Committee and no part or whole shall be retained by a candidate under any circumstances. Any attempt to retain or take away these materials by a candidate shall be construed as serious misconduct and the candidate will be immediately disqualified and his paper will be seized and / or not valued.

15. Candidate should bring proof of identity bearing his/her photograph to the examination hall. Such proof could be one of Passport, Driving Licence, Ration Card with candidate's photo, Service Identity Card or Voter's Identity card only.
16. The Hall Superintendent will verify the identity of the examinee with reference to his/her photograph affixed on the Identification Slip portion of application forms and with reference to an acceptable identification document produced by the examinee. Failure to support proof of identities by non-production of identity proof or if the photo does not resemble examinee will result in the expulsion of the examinee from the examination hall. The candidate will also be required to sign in full, various forms as part of the identification process. Failure to follow instructions will result in expulsion of the candidate.
17. Hall Tickets will not be sent. A letter of acknowledgement (Intimation Letter) will be sent to candidates who have been admitted to the Entrance Examination after basic scrutiny. In case of non-receipt of this letter, a candidate may enquire from the Selection Committee office on the result of scrutiny of his/her application, Application Registration number, etc
18. Admission to the Entrance Examination does not confer upon the candidate any right for admission to the course.
19. There will be no rechecking, revaluation or recount of answer sheets. Answer keys will not be provided. The Selection Committee's decision in this matter is final.

B. DECLARATION OF MERIT LIST :

1. After the evaluation of the OMR sheets of the candidates through scanning, the marks obtained by the candidates for the maximum of 200 marks is computed to a maximum of 90 marks
2. Experience marks will be calculated for each applicant in the following method
One (1) mark for each completed year after the completion of CRRI shall be awarded as marks for experience for both Service/ Non-Service candidates to a maximum of TEN marks as on 31-3-2012. TWO marks will be awarded to each completed year of Government Service in hilly areas and it will be limited to a maximum of TEN marks. Altogether the total marks awarded for experience/ hill station service will be restricted to TEN marks to all candidates. Fractional values of a year will not be counted for awarding marks for experience and hill station service.
3. The merit list will be arrived at by taking together the marks obtained in the entrance examination and the marks awarded for experience / Hill Station service or both. for example: If a candidate scores 50 marks in Entrance Examination and has Completed two years experience as on 31-3-2012 after CRRI or one year of Hill station service the total aggregate Marks will be $50 + 2 = 52$)

C. COUNSELLING

1. Personal appearance during counselling along with all original certificates is compulsory for all eligible candidates applying for admission to the Post-Graduate courses to verify identity with reference to Application. Separate letter for counselling will be issued. The counselling date will be announced through media (Leading newspapers), and also through website. Candidates who are absent at the time of Counselling will not be considered for selection and no protest will be admitted in this regard.
2. Candidates securing less than 40% of total marks in case of OC, BC, BCM and MBC/DC communities and below 35% of total marks, in the case of SC / SC(A) / ST communities shall not be considered for Counselling. For Service candidates, the minimum eligibility marks for admission to counselling will be 35% for all communities.
3. In case more than one candidate has secured the same number of marks the tie shall be resolved on the basis of the following factors in the order of priority.
 - i) Marks obtained in the Entrance Examination
 - ii) Percentage of marks obtained in the Final year examination (Theory, Oral and Clinical marks taken together)
 - iii) Least number of attempts in passing the final year BHMS examination.
 - iv) Seniority in Age will be preferred.
4. Exact number of seats available for allotment during counseling may change due to various orders issued at later dates by the Recognizing and Affiliating Bodies. However, the exact distribution of seats Specialty wise will be displayed on the notice board before the commencement of Counselling.
5. The rule of reservation is applicable wherever there are eight seats and more in each discipline.
6. Allotment of Branches will be made at the time of Counselling to be conducted by the Selection Committee at the Office of the Commissionerate of Indian Medicine and Homoeopathy in Chennai based on marks obtained by the candidates in the Entrance Examination and Service marks taken together. Branch once opted and allotted to the candidate at the time of Counselling cannot be changed subsequently under any circumstances.
7. Candidates who are selected at the time of counselling shall make a fee deposit of a sum of Rs.5,000/- (Rupees Five thousand only) by way of Demand Draft drawn on or after 10.05.2012 in favour of the Director of Indian Medicine and Homœopathy, Chennai - 106 payable at Chennai, immediately to the Committee and will thereupon be issued a formal allotment order. No allotment order will be

issued if payment is not made immediately and the seat will be allotted to the next meritorious candidate. After receipt of the joining report from the Principal of the Medical college, this amount will be transmitted to the college to be adjusted against the tuition fees to be paid by the candidate. If the candidate fails to join the course within the stipulated time/day after getting allotment order he/she shall forfeit this amount and any other payments done by him/her and also lose the right to join the current session of the M.D (Homoeopathy) course. The candidates selected for M.D(Homoeopathy) course will have to remit a non-refundable amount of Rs.500/- (Rupees Five hundred only) by means of Demand Draft drawn on or after 10-05-2012 in favour of the "Director of Indian Medicine and Homoeopathy, Chennai 106" as processing fee for allotment of seats through counselling.

8. The Post Graduate Degree course {M.D (Homoeopathy)} admissions for 2012-2013 session will close on the cut off date of admission as prescribed by the Tamil Nadu Dr.M.G.R. Medical University for the academic year 2012-2013.
9. Candidates who have joined Post-Graduate Degree course M.D (Homoeopathy) in any discipline and have discontinued the course on any grounds within six months shall be eligible to apply only after a period of two years from the date of discontinuance of the course if their discontinuance has resulted in a seat being wasted, and if such candidate's discontinuance does not result in a seat being wasted, he/she can apply for the next selection for which he/she is eligible. The Selection Committee's decision in this regard shall be final.
10. Roster method of rule of reservation will be followed if the seats are more than One and less than eight in each branch as per G.O.Ms.No. 241 dt: 29-10-2007 of P&AR(K) Dept. This is subject to the final verdict of the Supreme Court of India in SLP 14014-15/09 filed by the Government of Tamil Nadu against the orders passed by the Bench of the High Court of Madras dt: 12-05-2009 in W.A.No. 763 and 764 of 2007 and W.P. No. 7067 of 2009
11. Selected candidates should furnish the Discipline Declaration by the Candidate in the proforma prescribed in Annexure .

IV. CATEGORISATION OF SERVICE CANDIDATES & NON-SERVICE CANDIDATES

The following categories of medical officers will be treated as Service Candidates for the purpose of allotment of seats.

- i) Medical Officers selected by the TNPSC and appointed in Tamil Nadu Medical Service on regular basis, with minimum of Two Years continuous service as on 31-03-2012.

ii) Medical officers serving (continuously for two years) Local Bodies in Tamil Nadu.

iii) Those Service Candidates (selected by TNPSC) who have put in LESS THAN TWO YEARS of continuous regular service as on 31-03-2012 either in Tamil Nadu Medical Service or in Local Bodies are not eligible to apply for P.G. Degree M.D(Homoeopathy) course. Fractional values of a year will not be counted.

iv) Service candidates shall furnish their Service Particulars in the proforma prescribed in Annexure

v) 10(a) (i) candidates / Contract Medical Consultants not selected by TNPSC will not be considered as Service Candidates. If selected for any Post Graduate course they have to submit their resignation. They will be considered as Service Candidates if they have been selected by TNPSC at the time of Counseling and have completed TWO years of service. If any Medical Officer including 10 (a) (i) candidates/ Contract Medical Officers after Selection by TNPSC apply as Private candidates suppressing the fact of their selection, they will be debarred for TWO years further appropriate legal action will be taken against them.

(v) Candidates working in Institutions coming under “ Registered under Societies Act: and Self Financing institutions shall be considered as Non Service candidates.

V. TUITION FEE PAYABLE - M.D (Homoeopathy)

As fixed by the Committee appointed by the Government of Tamil Nadu.

- a. Service candidates taking allotment in Self-financing colleges will not be paid salary and they have to avail leave to which they are eligible for the period of study on their own after obtaining prior permission from their Head of the Directorate concerned.
- b. Stipend/ Fee structure / Bond amount / any other conditions will be as per the Institution admitted into.
- c. The seat matrix for self- financing Institution will be displayed during the counselling

VI. PROCEDURE FOR FILLING THE APPLICATION

1. Candidate should send the application in the prescribed form sent along with prospectus which should be filled up in his/her own hand writing.
2. Except with regard to those candidates who have studied from 9th Standard onwards and have undergone undergraduate course (B.H.M.S.) in

Tamil Nadu, others seeking admission should furnish permanent residence certificate in the Form annexed.

4. Service candidates should send their filled-in application through proper channel with forwarding authority's remarks.
5. Advance copy of application from service candidates will not be considered.
6. Candidates must enclose only attested photocopies of documents
7. It will be the responsibility of the candidates to give correct mailing address on the Intimation slip. If there is any change of address, it should be immediately intimated to the Selection Committee.
8. The Selection Committee shall not be held responsible for any loss in transit or for incorrect address given by the candidate.

10. Attested Photocopy of Transfer Certificate.
11. Eligibility Certificate from The Tamilnadu Dr.M.G.R. Medical University for candidates who have qualified from other Universities. This should be produced before counseling when called for.
12. The candidates who join Post Graduate Degree course should not indulge in any kind of agitation/ strike/ ragging activity inside/outside the college campus during the course of study.
13. Candidates found to take part in any such activities mentioned above will be expelled from the course/college at any part of the course of study and criminal action will be taken against them.
