Applications for the Management Quota seats will be issued between 8.00 a.m. and 12.00 Noon at the venue of the above counseling on 12.12.2019. Candidates can get the Application Forms by paying Rs.1000/- (Rupees One Thousand only) towards the Application cost. Further Filled in Application with all required enclosures should be submitted before 01.00 p.m on the same day. In continuation, Merit List for the Walk-in Counseling for Management Quota seats based on the Applicant's NEET-2019 score will be declared at 3.00 p.m. Counseling for Management Quota seats will be conducted immediately on completion of Counseling for Surrendered seats to Govt. in that college. Further all the relevant rules and regulations that are found in the Prospectus meant for ASU&H Degree courses 2019-20 session, brought out based on G.O.(D)No.1361/H&FW Dept., dated 22.08.2019 will be applicable to all the candidates who participate in this Walk-in Counseling also.

2	The admissions in the State of Tamil Nadu are as per the provisions of the Government of Tamil Nadu and in compliance to the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education In Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2018 and the Homoeopathy (Degree Course) Amendment Regulations, 2018 shall be based solely on marks obtained in the National Eligibility-Cum-Entrance Test (NEET UG-2019)
3	As per amended Regulations, the seat matrices for admission in the Self-Financing Institutions shall be fifteen per cent for the All India Quota and eighty five per cent for the States Quota for the academic year 2019-2020. Further Apportionment of seats between Government and Management of Self–Financing Minority and Non-Minority IM & H Colleges will be as per existing State policy and Central Council of Indian Medicine / Central Council of Homoeopathy regulations.

1	<b>ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:-</b> Candidate should be a citizen of India.
2	<b>AGE LIMIT :</b> As per amended regulations No candidate shall be admitted to BSMS / BAMS / BHMS Degree Course unless one has attained the age of Seventeen Years on or before the 31 <sup>st</sup> December of the year of admission in the first year of the course and not more than of Twenty Five years on or before the 31 <sup>st</sup> December of the year of admission in the first year of the course.  Further, the upper age limit is relaxed by five years in the case of BC /BC(M) / MBC / DC / SC / SCA/ ST and Orthopedically Physically Disabled Candidates.
3	<b>EDUCATIONAL QUALIFICATIONS:</b>  (i) In compliance to the amended rules & regulations as effected by CCIM & CCH with prior sanction of the Ministry of AYUSH, Govt. of India through their Notifications on 10/12/2018 & 17/12/2018 in the Gazette of India Extra ordinary respectively, the eligibility for admission to BSMS / BAMS / BHMS Degree courses for this academic year shall be based solely on marks obtained in the National Eligibility - cum - Entrance Test (NEETUG – 2019) conducted by NTA, New Delhi.  (ii) In order to be eligible for admission to BSMS / BAMS / BHMS Degree courses for this academic year, it shall be necessary for a candidate to obtain minimum of marks at 50 <sup>th</sup> Percentile in NEETUG-2019. However in respect of candidates belonging to BC /BC(M) / MBC / DC / SC / SCA/ ST, the minimum marks shall be at 40 <sup>th</sup> Percentile in NEETUG-2019. In respect of candidates with Locomotory disability of lower limbs alone the minimum marks shall be at 45 <sup>th</sup> Percentile for General Category candidates and 40 <sup>th</sup> Percentile for BC /BC(M) / MBC / DC / SC / SCA/ ST candidates in NEET UG-2019.  (iii) Provided when sufficient number of candidates in the respective category fail to secure minimum marks as prescribed in National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test held for this academic year for admission to BSMS / BAMS / BHMS Degree courses the Central Government in consultation with CCIM / CCH may at its discretion lower the minimum marks required for admission to BSMS / BAMS / BHMS Degree courses for candidates belonging to respective categories and marks so lowered by the Central Government shall be applicable for this academic year only. If such situation arises, fresh application will <b>NOT</b> be entertained.  <b>Explanatory Note : “Also Candidates, with NEET UG 2019 score Percentile lesser than 50<sup>th</sup> Percentile or 40<sup>th</sup> Percentile as the case may be, may also apply, if they will so, in anticipation of downward revision of minimum eligible percentile by the Ministry of AYUSH, Govt. of India for the Academic Session 2019-20. Such applicants will find a place in the General Merit List only when such downward revision of Minimum Eligible Percentile is ordered by the Ministry of AYUSH, New Delhi at its discretion in concurrence with CCIM and CCH for this academic year 2019-20”.</b>

(iv) Further, to be eligible for admission to BSMS / BAMS / BHMS Degree courses, Candidates must have passed in all the subjects of the qualifying examination of the Higher Secondary Certificate Examination (Academic) conducted by the Tamil Nadu State Board or any other equivalent Board with the subjects of Physics, Chemistry, Biology / Botany and Zoology and English individually and must have obtained minimum of fifty percent of marks taken together in Physics, Chemistry, Biology / Botany and Zoology at the aforesaid qualifying examination in the case of general category and forty percent mark in the case of BC /BC(M) / MBC / DC / SC / SCA/ ST category. In respect of Orthopedically Physically Disabled candidates the minimum qualifying marks in the said qualifying examination in Physics, Chemistry, Biology / Botany and Zoology shall be forty five percent in the case of general category and forty percent in the case of BC /BC(M) / MBC / DC / SC / SCA/ ST.

(v) **Language qualification for BSMS Course**

In addition to the required minimum percentile in the NEETUG-2019

1. The candidate should have studied in Tamil medium up to X or XII Standard, or
2. The candidate should have studied Tamil as a subject up to X or XII Standard, or
3. The candidate must be prepared to pursue the study of Tamil Language as a subject during the First professional course of B.S.M.S. course, to become eligible to take the other subjects examination of the BSMS Course.

**NOTE:-** Candidates who have passed any other equivalent examinations with same subjects as mentioned above in clause 3 (iv) should produce the eligibility certificate from The Tamil Nadu Dr. MGR Medical University before the counselling date or before attending the counselling.

(xi) If a candidate opts out of / not willing to take any seat when seats are available in the particular course at the time of his / her counselling for Management Quota seat, then he/she will not be eligible for the same seat in that particular course at any point of time later for whatsoever reason.

(xii) Candidates getting allotment, for any **other** reasons, at a later date after the counselling is over will be given a seat in the existing vacancies available in any one of the colleges Under Management Quota Seats irrespective of their merit of marks.

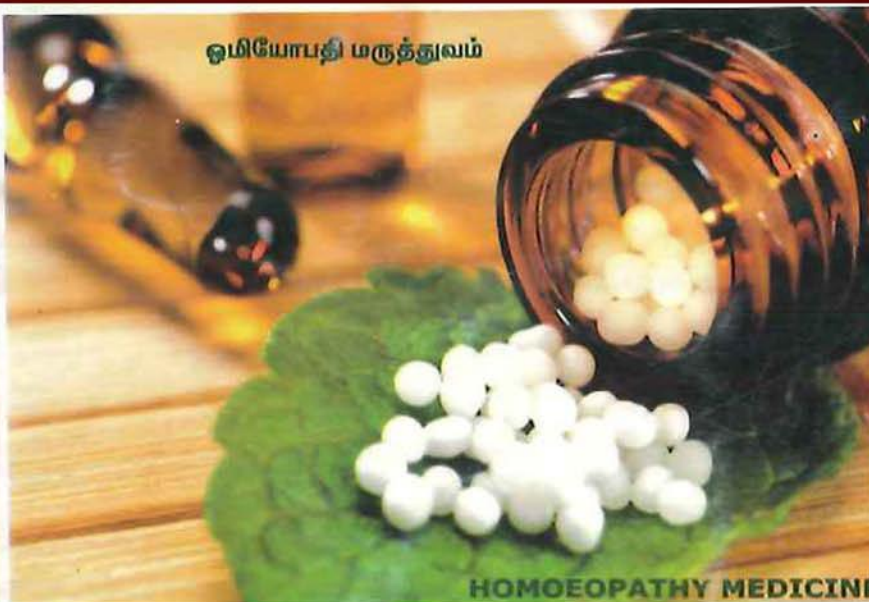
